



Cellist Martin Krátký is a graduate of the University of Toronto and the Oberlin Conservatory, where he earned a Master's Degree in historical performance. Immediately winning the principal position with the Saskatoon Symphony, he also completed two residencies at the Banff Centre and has participated in numerous chamber music festivals across the continent. In 2009 he joined the Kamloops Symphony as principal cellist; two years later he won the assistant principal seat in the Okanagan Symphony Orchestra. Martin teaches at the Kamloops Symphony Music School and the Kelowna Community Music School; he has also been on faculty at the Strings the Thing summer intensive in Penticton. A founding member of the Sycamore String Quartet, Martin is an active chamber musician and soloist. In his off-time he works on building up and landscaping his 60-acre property.
